2022 State - Tree Climbing Competition



The state tree climbing competition sponsored by STIHL SHOP - Osborne Park was held in October 2022 at the beautiful Point Walter Reserve in Bicton.

The event had a notable increase in public attendance, more importantly exposing the industry and Arbwest to a greater public audience. It also had the largest ever prize pool on offer in the events history and across Australia for that matter, with over \$15,000 worth of equipment and prize money up for grabs from multiple sponsors. This bodes well for the future of the event, and it's increase in scope, size and attendance into the future.

The event is not just for the best climbers in the state and interstate coming together to show their skills and compete, it's also about the opportunity for those new to the industry and learning the craft of climbing to see and learn from the best and see new equipment advancements and climbing techniques in action.

ISA TRAQ COURSE



There is an upcoming ISA Tree Risk Assessment Qualification (TRAQ) course, held over 3 days being conducted on the 14th to 16th of March 2023 by Mark Roberts.



This is the first such training in Perth for some years and one not to be missed.

With only 20 positions available for this course, best not procrastinate, book your spot before it's sold out – regsitrations close 14th of February.

There are prerequisites to attend this course so check out the details to make certain you are eligible. Registrations for this course are now open and available on: HERE.

The TRAQ qualification consists of a two-day educational course followed by a half-day assessment that includes both a written and a field component. You must attend the course and successfully complete the assessment to receive this qualification.

Participants will learn.

- Tree Biology and Mechanics.
- How to assess wood structure, decay, tree mechanics, and evaluate their impact on likelihood of tree or tree part failure.
- Tree Inspection and Assessment
- Types of targets, assess the likelihood of a tree or tree part impacting a target, and estimate the consequences
- Data Analysis and Risk Categorisation
 How to combine likelihood of failure, likelihood of impact, consequences of failure to derive a risk rating.
- Risk Reporting Learn skills to clearly communicate tree risk to clients.




